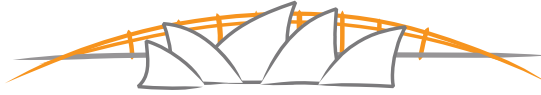

In this cutting-edge, hands-on presentation, Dr. Mamutil will show you how to work with 3D Cone Beam images, including how to correctly take your usual clinical photos, which can then be merged with the 3D Cone Beam images for truly sensational case presentations. - Critical Decision Making for the Orthodontic Clinical Assistant – Do it Right!, Kevin Theroux, USA (Monday AM)**  
This presentation is geared toward the Clinical assistant (Hygienist/Therapist) with at least one year of clinical experience who wants to increase his/her value within the practice. This will be a fast paced program driven by one concept – the more you understand about why we do certain things clinically, the more you can contribute to getting the patient an excellent result. More than 20 every day clinical situations will be presented:
  - When can you anticipate anterior spacing developing? Put the powerchain on ahead of time and avoid the emergency appointment.
  - The wire the doctor requested won't fit today. Why it won't fit next time either.
  - When you should fully engage a high canine in the wire and when you should not.
  - What forces are on that powerchain and how does that affect how you tie that patient in?
  - Why do some archwires need to be cinched and others not?
  - How to determine what elastics a patient should be wearing.
  - Why won't that space close? I know why, Doctor!
  - Don't set up situations which cause opposite forces to be applied to a tooth.
- Making the Bottom Line Work for You!, Terry Selke, USA**  
How do you measure the "health" of your practice? The methods used by most orthodontists are gross income rear to year, and net income year to year.
